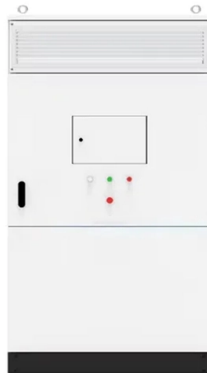

Separation Distance: While fiber optics are less affected by EMI, a recommended soil separation of 12–24 inches is often suggested for safety, locating purposes, and maintenance access.

Coordination: Installation should be coordinated between power and communication service providers to ensure compliance with local regulations and operational safety.
