

Brazil increases tariffs on optical cables



Overview

The Brazilian market for optical fiber and cables is undergoing a major shift, driven by a recent government decision to increase import tariffs to 35%. According to the latest official notice, Brazil will raise tariffs on various imported products, including optical cables and fibers, with some. Recently, the Brazilian government issued a public announcement stating that it had reviewed a series of matters and decided to implement corresponding measures such as reducing or exempting import tariffs, increasing import tariffs, and imposing anti-dumping duties on the relevant products. Brazil has imposed new tariffs on various imports from China, including a 35% tariff on fibre optic cables and a 25% increase on iron and steel products. The Foreign Trade Chamber Executive Committee (Gecex) justified these tariffs by citing a 'significant increase in imports that harmed national. In October 2024, the government of Brazil modified the List of Exceptions for Computer and Telecommunications Goods and Capital Goods (LEBIT/BK list) and the List of Exceptions to the Common External Tariff (LETEC). The changes were introduced via an amendment of Annexes V and VI of GECEX. The Ministry of Development, Industry and Trade is gearing up to meet with Feninfra (the National Federation of Infrastructure and Networks) over newly imposed anti-dumping tariffs on fiber optics and cables from China. This meeting zeroes in on a heated issue.
