Key Connection Methods

- Splice Plates** Flat metal plates with pre-drilled holes used to join two tray sections in a straight line. Provide strong, secure connections suitable for most tray types. Require tools like spanners or torque wrenches and take more installation time, but allow for future adjustments and maintenance.
- Bolted Connections** Use bolts to secure tray ends together, often in combination with splice plates. Offer high load-bearing capacity and durability. Can be undone for modifications, making them ideal for evolving server room setups.
- Quick-Connect Systems** Proprietary systems that snap, slide, or twist together. Fast installation with minimal tools, saving labor time. Typically brand-specific and may have higher upfront costs, suitable for large projects where speed is critical.
- Clamps and Fish Plates** Used for angled connections, junctions, or T/Cross-shaped tray intersections. Help route cables around corners while maintaining structural integrity.
- Welding** Provides a permanent, extremely strong connection. Less flexible for future changes and generally used in heavy-duty or industrial installations.

- Airflow Considerations:** Position trays to avoid obstructing hot aisle/cold aisle airflow, critical for cooling efficiency.
