Follow NEC fill limits: power cables should not exceed 40% of the tray's cross-sectional area, and control or instrumentation cables should not exceed 50%. Overfilling can cause overheating, mechanical failure, and safety hazards.
3. Support and Spacing Install cable trays on walls, columns, beams, or floors with support arms spaced approximately 1.5–3 meters apart, adjusted for specific conditions. Avoid placing tray joints at mid-span or directly on support points to prevent sagging and maintain a tidy appearance.
4. Accessibility and Maintenance Maintain at least 12 inches of vertical clearance above trays for installation and maintenance. Ensure trays remain accessible and are not enclosed in hoistways or confined spaces. Proper access allows for future cable additions and inspections without creating a messy or unsafe environment.
5. Environmental Considerations Use corrosion-resistant materials or covers when trays are near corrosive liquids or gases, and apply thermal insulation when trays are near hot pipelines. For outdoor installations, implement rainproof m...
