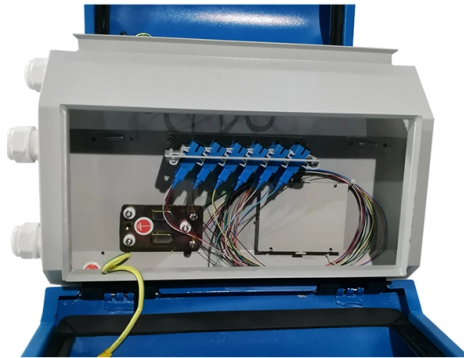

In buildings without false ceilings, ducts, cable trays, and other suspended services can obstruct sprinkler discharge patterns. Route.
