- Switch Compatibility:** Some switches may have vendor-specific firmware that restricts third-party modules. Using compatible or “vendor-approved” third-party modules can overcome this limitation without affecting performance.
- Performance and Warranty:** Properly matched third-party modules generally do not degrade switch performance and do not void the manufacturer's warranty.
- Simultaneous Use of Different Speeds:** Modules of different speeds (e.g., 1G and 10G) can be used on the same network if specifications match, but the lower-speed module will limit the link speed.
