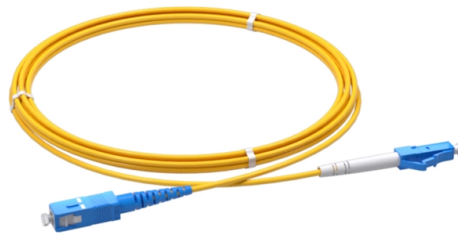


Collecting fiber optic cables

Understanding Fiber Optic Cables Fiber optic cables are composed of glass fibers, polymer coatings, strength members (like Kevlar), and sometimes metal armor. Unlike copper cables, they are a mixed-material product, which requires careful handling and specialized recycling processes.

Common types include:

- Patch cords/jumpers:** Used in data centers and telecom racks
- Trunk/backbone cables:** For main network runs
- Aerial/underground armored fiber:** For utilities and outside plant installations
- Hybrid cables:** Fiber combined with power or coaxial lines

Safe Handling Practices Handling fiber optic cables requires precautions due to sharp glass fibers and potential chemical exposure:

- Wear safety glasses, gloves, long sleeves, and a dust mask** when cutting or stripping cables.
- Use a designated work area** with smooth, cleanable surfaces and good ventilation.
- Collect fiber shards and clippings immediately** in a labeled container to prevent injury and contamination.
- Avoid mixing fiber scrap** with general trash or liquids, as contamination complicates recycling.

Preparing Fiber Optic Cables for Collection

- Sort by type:** Separate patch cords, trunk cables, armored cables, and spools/reels.
- Clean and coil:** Coil scrap into manageable loops and contain them in lidded totes, pallets, or Gaylord boxes.
- Separate packaging:** Spools, reels, and covers should be sorted by material (plastic, wood, metal) for proper recycling or refurbishment.
- Document and label:** Track quantities, condition, and type of cable or packaging for recycling records.

Recycling and Disposal Options

- Electronics recycling partners:** Ideal for mixed telecom scrap, including cables, racks, and small devices. They provide controlled routing, documentation, and vendor oversight.
- Specialized fiber recyclers:** Companies like Net Recycling and LD4 Recycling process fiber scrap, refurbish spools, and recycle plast...
