Clamps and Fish Plates Clamps or fish plates are used to join tray sections at angles or junctions, such as L, T, or cross-shaped connections. They provide secure mechanical support and help route cables around corners or splits.

Welding In some industrial applications, welding may be used for a permanent, high-strength connection, though it is less common due to the difficulty of future modifications.

Grounding and Bonding Considerations

Grounding Clamps: Metallic cable trays should be bonded using grounding clamps to maintain electrical continuity and act as an Equipment Grounding Conductor (EGC) where applicable. This prevents loose trays from causing electrical hazards under fault conditions.
