

Copper wire installation in distribution box

Wire Management and Safety Arrange wires neatly inside the box, using cable ties to prevent tangling and to maintain clearance for heat dissipation. Ensure all connections are firm and clearly marked for future inspection and maintenance. Use wires with a cross-sectional area suitable for the load, following local electrical codes.
