Factors Affecting Cost

- Fiber Count:** More fibers increase material costs proportionally.
- Fiber Type:** Single-mode is cheaper per foot than multimode but requires more expensive equipment.
- Cable Construction:** Indoor riser-rated cables are cheaper than plenum-rated or armored cables.
- Installation Environment:** Underground or harsh environments increase costs.
- Pre-termination:** Factory-terminated cables reduce field labor but increase material cost.
- Volume and Lead Time:** Bulk purchases reduce per-foot cost, while custom or low-volume orders are more expensive.
