

Do I need to remove both ends of the pigtail



Overview

Use wire strippers to remove about 5/8 inch to 3/4 inch of insulation from both ends of the pigtail wires and the existing circuit wires. This exposed length ensures the wires are fully engaged inside the wire nut without leaving bare copper exposed. This guide provides a step-by-step process for using this connection method for a more reliable electrical installation. The black (hot) pigtail connects to the brass screw. That short conductor is the pigtail, and its presence reflects one of the most important principles in residential electrical work: keeping the circuit continuous and reliable regardless of what happens at any single device. While it may look like extra work compared to simply looping the circuit. We always use pigtails, it doesn't take long to cut/strip a few dozen 6" lengths of black and white 14/2 and fit them to all the outlets while working at a convenient height on a bench. You have to use a marette to join the incoming earth wires to a single one to the earth tab anyway, and 2 more. An electrical pigtail is a short length of wire that bridges multiple circuit conductors to a single device terminal, keeping downstream outlets and switches powered even when one device is pulled out for repair.
