Main Panel: The neutral busbar is connected to the grounding busbar and the grounding electrode system (ground rods or other approved earth connections). This single-point bonding ensures that all neutral and ground paths reference the same potential (ElectricalTechnology).

Subpanel: The neutral busbar is mounted on insulators to isolate it from the panel enclosure and the ground busbar. Only the ground busbar is connected to the panel metal and grounding system. Each neutral wire from branch circuits is terminated individually on the neutral busbar, ensuring proper current return without energizing the panel (EngineerFix).
