Slack storage areas must be provided for excess fiber, with clear labeling for fiber type and length. Adapter panels support SC, LC, FC, or ST connectors for patch cords or drop cables, ensuring standardized connections.

Color Coding and Documentation Fibers should follow color coding standards for easy identification, with matching labels or rings inside and outside the box. Proper documentation and installation guides are essential for maintenance, troubleshooting, and network expansion.
