

Fiber Optic Splitters and Routers

The splitter divides the signal from the Optical Line Terminal (OLT) to multiple Optical Network Terminals (ONTs) at homes or businesses. This allows a single fiber to serve multiple endpoints efficiently, reducing infrastructure costs and fiber usage.

Router vs Splitter Function
Router/ONT: Active device that manages network traffic, converts optical signals to electrical signals for devices, and provides routing, Wi-Fi, or Ethernet connectivity.
Splitter: Passive device that only divides or combines optical signals; it does not perform routing, signal processing, or require power.

Routers and ONTs do not have built-in fiber optic splitters. Splitters are separate components in the fiber network, strategically placed to distribute optical signals from the service provider to multiple subscribers.
