Divide cables connected to devices evenly into left and right groups for placement in corresponding trays. Forming Bundles Arrange fibers neatly in parallel before bundling. Use fiber binding tape: the mat side contacts the fibers, and the hook side wraps around snugly. Apply moderate force; do not over-tighten. Bundles can contain up to 100 fibers of 2 mm diameter or 60 fibers of 3 mm diameter. Larger counts require multiple bundles. Rack Dressing and Organization Bundles are organized into looms, with lengths running parallel to reduce clutter and minimize electromagnetic interference. Color-coding or labeling bundles helps with identification and maintenance. Excess cable should be coiled neatly and secured to avoid strain on connectors. Bundles can be routed through overhead trays or under raised floors, depending on the room layout.
