- Splice capacity: Number of splices per tray or box, often following standards like DIN 47662, with trays supporting fusion or mechanical splices.
- Connector type: Front panels may include SC, LC, or hybrid connectors for fiber or RJ45 for copper.

Examples of Designation

- Indoor/Standard Splice Box: Rail-mountable module, IP20, metal housing, splicing connection, cable outlets above and below, suitable for Ethernet or fiber networks.
- Outdoor/Compact Distribution Box: Panel-mounted, compact design, protects fiber splices from environmental exposure, often with removable splice cassettes for easy installation.
- Hazardous Area Splice Box: GR.TFO or SR.TFO models in IP66 enclosures, stainless steel or GRP, designed for Zone 1/2 or Zone 21/22, supporting up to 8–12 fusion splices per tray, with strain relief and DIN-compliant splice trays.

Key Considerations

- Splice method: Fusion splicing is preferred for low-loss, high-reliability connections, while mechanical splicing is faster but less permanent.
- Environmental suitability: Outdoor and hazardous area boxes require higher IP ratings and robust materials to withstand temperature, moisture, and dust...
