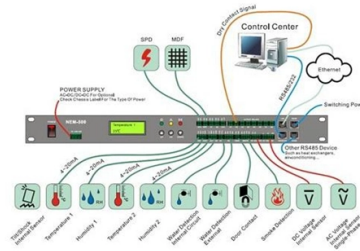


Gigabit fiber optic cable plugged into a 100Mbps router

Practical Implications Speed Limitation: Your download and upload speeds will max out at 100Mbps, even if your fiber plan offers 1Gbps or higher . Device Bottleneck: Multiple devices connected to a 100Mbps router may experience congestion, especially with streaming, gaming, or large file transfers. Future Upgrades: To fully utilize gigabit fiber, a router with Gigabit Ethernet ports and Wi-Fi 5/6/7 support is recommended . Popular options include the ASUS RT-AC86U, Netgear Nighthawk RS90, or TP-Link AX1800, which can handle multi-gigabit speeds and provide better wireless coverage . Recommendations Keep the 100Mbps router temporarily if your current usage is light and you don't need full gigabit speeds.
