

How to connect a fiber optic cable to a network port

Link ONT to Router (if applicable)

Use an Ethernet cable to connect the ONT's LAN port to your router's WAN port. Power on both devices and wait for the status lights to stabilize.

Using a Media Converter (Optional)

If your router does not have a fiber port, use a fiber-to-Ethernet media converter. Connect the fiber cable to the converter's fiber port and an Ethernet cable from the converter to your router.

Secure and Test the Connection

Ensure all connectors are properly aligned and locked. Manage excess cable with velcro straps or cable organizers to prevent tension or tight loops. Test the connection using net...
