

How to connect an outdoor two-core armored optical cable

Trim Exposed Armor: Use side cutters to remove protruding metal edges and any paper or plastic wrapping.

Remove Strength Members: Cut Kevlar or fiberglass rods carefully with specialized scissors to avoid fraying.

Expose Fiber: Strip the inner jacket to reveal the optical fibers without touching or damaging them ().

Splicing or Connectorization

Fusion Splicing: Align the fiber ends in a fusion splicer, ensuring precise core alignment. Use a heat-shrink sleeve to protect the splice. Perform splicing in a controlled environment, ideally inside a splice closure to minimize humidity exposure ().

Connector Termination: If using connectors, follow the manufacturer's instructions for proper polishing, cleaning, and insertion. Ensure connectors are rated for outdoor use and provide adequate IP protection against moisture ().
