

How to connect multiple pigtails in an optical fiber cable

 - Mechanical Splicing:** If a fusion splicer is unavailable, use a mechanical splice to hold the fibers in precise alignment with an index-matching gel. This method is slightly higher in loss but faster for temporary or field setups.
- 5. Protect the Splice** After splicing, slide a heat-shrink sleeve over the joint and apply heat to secure and protect the fiber from mechanical stress.
- 6. Organize and Test** Place the spliced fibers in a splice tray to prevent bending or damage. Test each connection using an OTDR (Optical Time-Domain Reflectometer) or a power meter to verify low-loss performance and proper signal transmission.

Tips for Multiple Pigtails

- Label each pigtail to avoid confusion in multi-strand cables.
- Match fiber types (single-mode vs multimode) and connector types (LC, SC, ST, etc.) to the existing network.
- Work sequentially.
