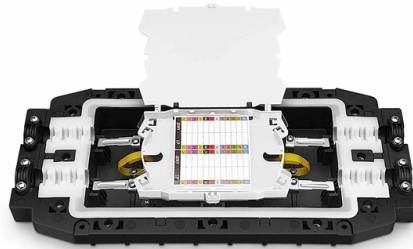


How to get a four-core optical cable into a terminal box
