

How to run fiber optic cables through a router

Position the router centrally in your home for optimal Wi-Fi coverage. Avoid bending or stressing the fiber cable, as it is fragile and can degrade signal quality.

Optional Configurations Some ISPs provide a combo unit that integrates the ONT and router in one device. For larger homes, consider mesh Wi-Fi systems to extend coverage...
