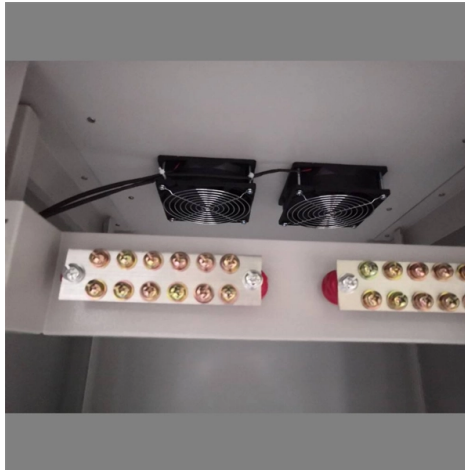


How to splice fiber optic terminal boxes

Splicing a fiber optic terminal box involves preparing the fibers, choosing a splicing method (fusion or mechanical), carefully joining the fibers, and organizing them in a splice tray for long-term stability.

Step 3: Choose a Splicing Method

Fusion Splicing: Uses a fusion splicer to weld two fiber ends together with an electric arc. This method provides low insertion loss (~ 0.1 dB) and high reliability, ideal for permanent connections.

Mechanical Splicing: Aligns fibers in a mechanical holder with index-matching gel. This is faster and allows temporary connections, but has slightly higher loss (~ 0.3 dB).

Step 4: Perform the Splice Align the fibers in the splicer or mechanical splice holder. Execute the splice according to the device instructions. For fusion splicing, the machine will heat and fuse the fibers; for mechanical splicing, ensure the gel is applied and fibers are properly seated.

Test the splice using an optical power meter or OTDR to verify low loss and proper signal transmission.

Step 5: Organize and Protect Fibers Place the spliced fibers into the splice tray inside the terminal box. Coil any excess fiber neatly to avoid sharp bends or stress. Secure the fibers with clips or holders provided in the tray. Close the terminal box, ensuring all cables are routed without tension and the enclosure is sealed against dust and moisture if outdoors.
