Use the provided slots or protective clamps to secure the splitter, especially for PLC splitters with a steel tube protecting the chip. Coil any excess fiber neatly to maintain proper bend radius and prevent damage.
- 6. Connect the Fibers** Use fiber optic adapters to dock and fix connectors securely. For bare splitters, perform splicing using a fusion splicer or mechanical splice kit, following proper winding and handling procedures.
- 7. Test the Connection** Perform an optical power test: ensure the input minus output power is within the nominal splitter loss (e.g., 1:8 PLC splitter ≈ 10.7 dB). Check uniformity: p...
