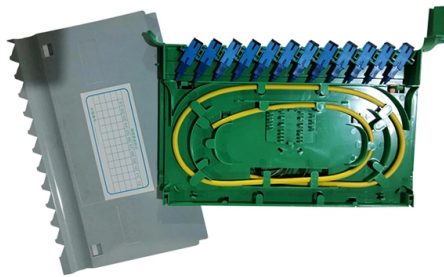


Is it prohibited to install electrical distribution boxes in stairwells



AI Overview

Electrical distribution boxes must not be installed in stairwells to ensure safe egress and comply with NEC and IBC codes. Code Requirements NEC (National Electrical Code) Section 240.24(F) prohibits overcurrent protective devices, such as circuit breakers, from being installed over the steps of a stairway, as this would compromise the required working space and create a hazard during use or maintenance (ECMag) . While panelboards may be installed on a stair landing if the working space is maintained, placing them directly over stairs is not allowed. IBC (International Building Code) 2021 Section 1023.5 restricts penetrations into or through interior exit stairways and ramps, allowing only essential systems such as fire protection, ventilation, or communication systems. Electrical raceways serving the stairway are permitted only if they terminate in a small steel box not exceeding 16 square inches, and general distribution panels are explicitly prohibited (ICCSafe) . NFPA guidance also emphasizes that stairwells must remain free of obstructions, including electrical panels, to maintain clear egress paths and reduce fire hazards (LinkedIn) .

Safety Considerations

Egress Safety: Stairwells are critical escape routes during emergencies. Installing electrical panels can obstruct movement and increase risk during evacuation.

Fire Hazard: Electrical equipment in stairwells can contribute to fire spread or impede firefighting efforts.

Maintenance Access: NEC requires sufficient working space around panels for safe operation and maintenance, which stair locations often cannot provide (Mike Holt Forums) .

Exceptions

Limited exceptions exist for electrical raceways serving fire department communication systems or other essential stairway systems, but these are tightly restricted in size and purpose (ICCSafe) . General distribution boxes or load centers do not qualify.

Electrical panels in rated stairwell
