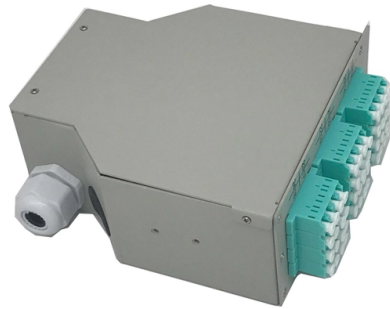

The LC duplex jumper ensures that the Tx signal from the MPO trunk reaches the correct Rx port on the device. In 10G duplex links, Type B jumpers are typically multimode only and require two different MPO modules (B1 and B2) at each end. For 40G and 100G parallel optics, Type B MPO jumpers are used with bulkhead adapters in patch panels instead of MPO-to-LC breakout modules, maintaining key-to-key alignment throughout the chain. Deployment Considerations Labeling and documentation are critical to avoid polarity mismatches, especially in hyperscale or AI server environments. Many MPO cassettes now allow field polarity switching, enabling technicians to flip polarity on-site if needed. Type B is the preferred standard for new data center builds in 2026, compatible with most modern parallel-optic transceivers.
