

Making a connector for indoor fiber optic cable

- Fusion Splicing to a Pre-Made Patch Cord:** Use a fusion splicer to join the prepared fiber to a factory-polished patch cord. This method ensures low insertion loss and high reliability but requires specialized equipment.
- Mechanical Splicing:** Align the fiber with a mechanical splice inside the connector. This is less expensive and faster but may have slightly higher loss than fusion splicing.
- Field-Terminated Connectors:** Some connectors allow direct termination in the field using adhesive or epoxy, followed by polishing. Ensure the fiber endface is polished flat to reduce signal loss.
