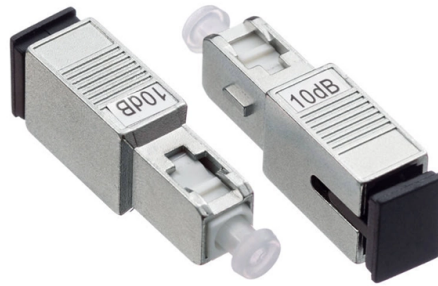


Naming conventions near the distribution box

- Aisle:** Parallel rows within the zone; numbering should allow flexibility and may use odd/even numbers for one-way paths.
- Rack/Bay:** Individual shelving units within an aisle; numbering can reset at cross aisles to create sections.
- Shelf/Level:** Horizontal levels within a rack; typically start from the floor for easy access to fast-moving items.
- Bin:** Specific storage position on a shelf; can include letters or numbers to indicate precise placement.

Example: A04-03-B-03 indicates Zone A, Aisle 04, Rack 03, Shelf B, Bin 03.

Best Practices

- Serpentine Picking:** Arrange aisle numbering to support a continuous pick path, reducing walking time.
- Software Integration:** Ensure the naming scheme aligns with your warehouse management system for accurate tracking and reporting.
- Label Placement:** Clearly label each location on the front of racks and bins for easy visibility.
- Future-Proofing:** Avoid starting numbering at 01; begin with 10 or higher to allow for additional aisles or racks later.
