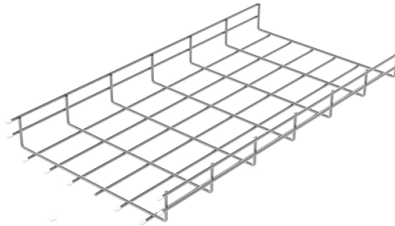


No circuit breaker installed without a distribution box
