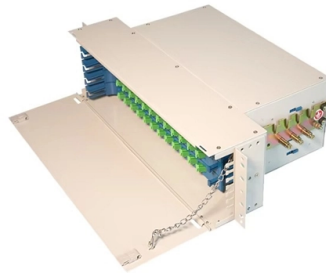

Wireless Networking For locations where cabling is impractical, wireless solutions such as Wi-Fi 6/6E or point-to-point wireless bridges can replace fiber. High-speed wireless links can cover hundreds of meters and support multiple devices, though they may be affected by environmental factors like walls, interference, or weather. Hybrid Approaches A hybrid network can combine copper, wireless, and limited fiber segments. For instance, you can run copper Ethernet within a building and use media converters or wireless bridges to connect separate buildings. This approach balances cost, performance, and installation complexity. Best Practices Ensure cables are properly rated for your network speed and distance requirements. Use surge protection for outdoor or long-distance copper runs. Regularly inspect and maintain connectors to prevent signal loss. Consider network switches with PoE to power devices like cameras or access points without additional wiring. B...
