

Requirements for Distance Setting of Distribution Boxes

Distribution boxes should be installed at heights between 1.3–1.5 meters for fixed units, with horizontal spacing not exceeding 30 meters to switch boxes and 3 meters to controlled equipment, ensuring accessibility, safety, and compliance with standards.

Vertical Installation Height
Fixed distribution boxes: The bottom of the enclosure should be 1.3 to 1.5 meters above the ground to allow comfortable operation and maintenance.

Mobile distribution boxes: The bottom should be 0.6 to 1.5 meters above the ground for ergonomic handling.

Residential units: Recommended height is 1 to 1.8 meters, with 1.3 meters suggested for elderly or handicapped users.
Wall-mounted enclosures: Bottom openings are typically 1.2 to 1.5 meters from the floor, with uniformity maintained within 10 mm for aesthetic and management purposes.

Horizontal Spacing and Proximity
Distribution box to switch box: Maximum distance should not exceed 30 meters.
Switch box to fixed electrical equipment: Maximum horizontal distance is 3 meters.
Dedicated switch boxes: Each electrical device should have its own switch box with a residual current device (RCD) rated ≤ 30 mA and tripping time ≤ 0.1 s.

Safety and Accessibility

Considerations
 Maintain adequate working space around distribution boxes to allow inspection, maintenance, and emergency access. Ensure doors can open at least 90 degrees and that the workspace is free from obstructions.

Install boxes in dry, ventilated, and easily accessible locations, avoiding corrosive or hazardous environments.

Use locks on all doors and avoid storing unrelated items inside the boxes.

Compliance with Standards
 Follow IEC 60364, IEC 61439, BS 7671, and NEC for design, installation, and safety requirements. Ensure IP/NEMA ratings are appropriate for indoor or outdoor use (e.g., IP54 for industrial indoor, IP66 for outdoor), .Maintai...
