Routing and Management: Fibers should be coiled neatly in the tray, avoiding sharp bends, and labeled for identification. Proper slack management ensures that fibers can be accessed for maintenance without disturbing other connections. Standards and Guidelines ITU-T L.208 specifies requirements for fiber distribution boxes, including fiber management systems, cable attachment, and termination, emphasizing adequate slack storage for operational flexibility. FOA Installation Standards recommend leaving sufficient slack to allow for future re-termination, splicing, or network expansion, typically aligning with the 1–3 meter range.
