This port is often labeled and colored differently to distinguish it from LAN ports. The router then distributes the internet connection to your devices via wired or wireless connections.

Routers Optimized for Fiber While any router can technically work with fiber via an ONT, routers designed for fiber internet offer features to fully utilize high-speed connections:

- Multi-gig WAN ports:** For fiber plans above 1 Gbps, routers with 2.5 Gbps, 5 Gbps, or 10 Gbps WAN ports prevent bottlenecks.
- SFP+ cages:** Some high-end routers allow direct fiber connections using SFP+ modules, eliminating the need for a separate ONT in certain setups.
- Wi-Fi 6 or Wi-Fi 7 support:** These standards maximize wireless throughput to match fiber speeds.
- High-performance CPUs and RAM:** Routers with quad-core processors and sufficient memory handle multiple devices and high-bandwidth tasks without lag.

Popular examples include the NETGEAR Nighthawk RS700S and ASUS RT-BE86U, which feature multi-gig WAN ports, Wi-Fi 7, and robust internal antennas for large coverage areas.
