Industrial panels: For IP54-rated boards, a maximum mounting area of 1.5 meters width, 1.2 meters height, and 0.5 meters depth is suggested, ensuring adequate working space around components. Clearance: BS 7671 and IEC 61439 require sufficient space around panels for safe access, operation, and maintenance. Outdoor Distribution Boxes Outdoor boxes must comply with NEC Article 312 and NEMA/IP ratings: Bending space: NEC 312.9 requires additional space for conductor bending and door closure, typically 1 inch clearance for the door. Environmental protection: Minimum NEMA 3R or IP66 rating is recommended for wet or corrosive environments. Busbar sizing: Must accommodate continuous current plus 125% of non-continuous loads, with spacing designed to prevent overheating. Practical Considerations Ensure adequate box volume to prevent overcrowding of conductors, which can lead to insulation damage or fire hazards.
