Connecting Switches with Fiber To connect switches using fiber, you need: Fiber-capable switches or SFP (Small Form-factor Pluggable) modules for standard switches. Fiber optic cables (single-mode for long distances, multi-mode for shorter distances). Fiber connectors such as LC, SC, or ST, depending on the switch ports. Optional media converters to adapt between copper Ethernet and fiber if needed. The physical connection involves plugging the fiber cable into the SFP module or fiber port on each switch. Configuration may include enabling the SFP port and setting the correct speed and duplex settings.
