

There is no space for cable trays in the stairwell



Overview

Code Change Summary: Revised code language in Section 392. 18 (F) now specifies a minimum of 12 inches of space above cable trays to ensure access for installation and maintenance. Is it NEC- compliant to place a load center in the wall of a stairway?

It seems like the working space in front of this equipment would be compromised by the stairs. Panelboards contain circuit breakers that are overcurrent devices. 24 (F) prohibits overcurrent protective devices from. The primary rulebook used in the safe use of cable trays is NEC Article 392. NEC Article 392 covers the requirements for cable tray systems, including the types of trays recognized, which wiring methods can be installed. The spacing between trays, whether horizontal or vertical, depends on various factors like cable type, environment, and tray material. Proper installation can significantly reduce electromagnetic interference, prevent fire hazards, and improve overall efficiency.
