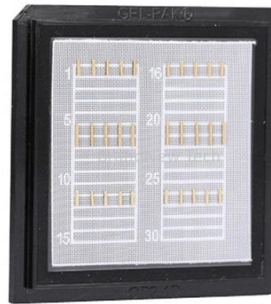


## Two wires are used together in the distribution box

  - Neutral Wire:** Connect to the neutral busbar. If two neutral wires are present, they can be connected directly to the busbar or joined with a pigtail to a single terminal.
  - Ground Wire:** Connect to the ground busbar. If multiple ground wires exist, twist them together with a short jumper wire and attach to the busbar.
- 5. Secure Connections** Tighten all screws firmly to ensure good electrical contact. Avoid over-tightening, which can damage the wire or terminal.
- 6. Organize and Close** Carefully fold the wires into the distribution box, ensuring no bare conductors are exposed. Close the panel cover securely.
- 7. Test the Circuit** Turn the main breaker back on and verify the connections using a circuit tester or multimeter to ensure proper voltage and continuity.

**Additional Tips** Always use wires rated for the current of the circuit. Maintain separation of neutral and ground in sub-panels to pre...
