Then connect the ONT to your router using an Ethernet cable if required. Connector Compatibility: Ensure the connector type matches the port on your device (e.g., SC/APC, SC/UPC, LC) and that single-mode or multi-mode fiber is used appropriately. Testing: After connection, test the network using standard tools to verify connectivity and performance. Running Fiber Cables in a Home or Office Plan the pathway carefully to minimize bends and stress points, avoiding areas with high heat, foot traffic, or sharp edges. Use soft Velcro ties or flexible low-voltage conduit to secure cables without crushing them. Pre-terminated cables simplify installation and reduce the risk of signal loss.
