Common connector types include LC, SC, MPO, and some optical ports can also accept electrical port modules for copper connections. Port Types and Labels Switches may label ports as G (Gigabit Ethernet), F (Fast Ethernet), E (Ethernet), or S (Serial/High-speed). A G port can be either electrical or optical, supporting 1G speeds, while F ports are typically 100M electrical ports. E ports provide standard Ethernet access, and S ports are high-speed serial interfaces used for router-to-router connections. Optical ports often appear as SFP/SFP+ or QSFP/QSFP28 slots, allowing flexible uplinks and long-distance connections.
