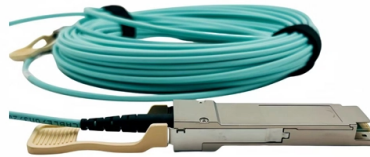


What to do if the fan at the top of the network server rack is too noisy
