

Wiring numbers for electrical cabinets

Core Principles of Wire Numbering

- System and Component Identification**
Wires are first associated with the system or component they belong to using uppercase letters or abbreviations. This helps distinguish between main circuits, control circuits, and auxiliary systems within the cabinet.
- Serial Numbering**
 - Single circuits:** Wires are numbered sequentially (1, 2, 3...) according to the wiring sequence.
 - Multiple circuits:** Circuit numbers are prefixed (e.g., 1-01, 1-02 for Circuit 1; 2-01, 2-02 for Circuit 2).
 - Crossing terminals or cabinets:** Terminal or cabinet numbers are added as suffixes (e.g., 103-TB2-04 indicates wire 103 connected to terminal 04 of TB2).
- Main Circuit (Power Circuit) Numbering**
Main circuits carry high current and require numbering that reflects component number, phase sequence, and serial number.
Format: Phase letter + Component number + Wire serial number (e.g., L1-KM1-01 for phase L1 of contactor KM1, wire 01).
 This facilitates tracing power flow and maintenance.
- Control Circuit (Secondary Circuit) Numbering**
Control circuits are low-current signal circuits, numbered according to functional partitions to simplify fault location.
Format: Optional partition prefix + numerical serial number (e.g., 1, 2, 3... for sequential control elements).
Example: Start-stop control of a three-phase motor:
 Power supply L1 → wire 1
 Stop button SB1 → wire 2
 Start button SB2 + KM1 auxiliary contact → wire 3
 Contactor coil KM1 → wire 4
 Thermal relay FR1 → wire 5 → L2 return.
- DC Circuit Numbering and Polarity**
Numbers are grouped by function or fuse circuits (e.g., 101-199 for 1KK, 201-299 for 2KK).
 Positive circuits use odd numbers, negative circuits use even numbers, with polarity changes after major components like coils or resistors.
 Signal circuits are grouped by function (fault, position, warning, command) and numbered sequentially.
